What does off-track endurance officiating involve?

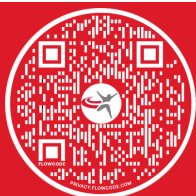
- Assisting with course set up/marketing/signage
- Race Day registration
- Supporting the start/finish areas
- Marshalling at junctions/key points
- Recording completed laps/finishing order

Three steps to become a Level 1 Endurance Official

1. Attend a Level 1 Endurance Official course and a risk awareness course (online or in person).
2. Complete the online safeguarding module.
3. Complete a DBS check online.

What does being a Photofinish official involve?

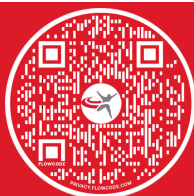
- Assisting with the set-up of the photofinish equipment
- Distributing any start-lists/results to start/track/timekeeping
- Capturing the final moments of each race on screen
- Reading the picture of each race
- Communicating with other areas as required e.g. start/track/timekeeping

What does being a Race Walking official involve?

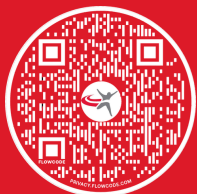
- Identifying any loss of contact or bent leg infringements
- Recording any yellow paddle or red cards issued to athletes
- Informing chief walks judge/recorder of any yellow or red cards

What does being a Field official involve?

- Checking athletes in at the event
- Calling up athletes for each jump/throw
- Indicating the validity of each jump/throw
- Measuring all jumps or throws
- Returning throwing implements or raking the pit

What does being a Track official involve?

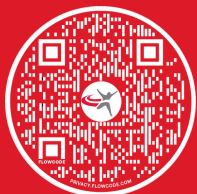
- Covering all angles around the track during each race
- Checking athletes stay in their lanes
- Reporting any infringements to Track Referee
- Using the lapboard and bell for number of laps remaining
- Judging the order of athletes crossing the finish line

...become an Athletics Timekeeper

What does being a Timekeeper involve?

- Signalling to the Starter that track/timekeepers are race ready
- Starting the stopwatch at the 'flash or smoke'
- Calling out any lap times to athletes as required
- Capturing and noting the times taken for each race
- Passing on recorded times to the Chief Timekeeper

2. Complete the online self-paced safeguarding and health/safety modules.
3. Complete a DBS Check and upload a licence photograph.

What does being a Starter/Starter's Assistant involve?

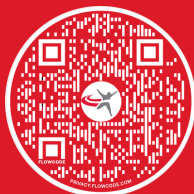
- Preparing athletes for their race: how, when and where to line up
